Strategic Ministry Planning Event

Sept 15th and 16th

You have been hearing about it all year, and now it's here our Strategic Ministry Planning Event. Faith uses this 3-year planning tool to gather input from the congregation to help chart our path forward. The decisions made at this event guide FLC's Leadership over the planning period as they seek to achieve the goal(s) set by the congregation. Instead of gathering everyone, crafting the best plans and strategies we can think of, and then asking God to bless them, we take a different approach. We come together with clean hands and a pure heart to seek God's will for His church in Eldersburg. When His Word is the center of our focus and the foundation of our decision-making, ministry priorities take precedence. From these priorities flow the decisions about site, facilities, staffing, programs, and money that can then be made quickly and confidently, knowing that our best understanding of God's will has been considered and included. We ask that the congregation keep this event in their prayers and use some of the verses below in their devotions leading up to the event.

The Goals and Tactics we will arrive at in September form the specifics of our overall plan that includes our Mission, Vision and Core Values statements. The latter of which has been reviewed by Leadership (Elders, SaLT, Ministry Team Leads) and will not be changing this 3-year cycle. Therefore, our meeting will totally focus on the goal(s) and tactics.

The event will be facilitated by Stan Stigdon and is open to all those worshipping at Faith, 9th grade and up. We will open the event at 7:00 p.m. Friday with a 2-hour session then re-convene on Saturday at 8:00 a.m. and conclude by mid-afternoon. Child care will be provided as we want all to be included. Throughout the event we will use a series of large and small group sessions to put into context who we are and how we got here, develop the challenges that lie ahead of us, and set our sight on the goal(s) God has in store for us. Once we have the goal or set of goals, we will put in place a set of SMART (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic and Timely) tactics that are needed to achieve the goal(s). Saturday will include a "working lunch" during one of our small group sessions. Light refreshments will also be provided Friday night and Saturday morning.

The full agenda will be presented the day of the event. The goal and tactics will be presented at that voters meeting and will be posted on the "About Faith" page on our website under a separate SMP tab.

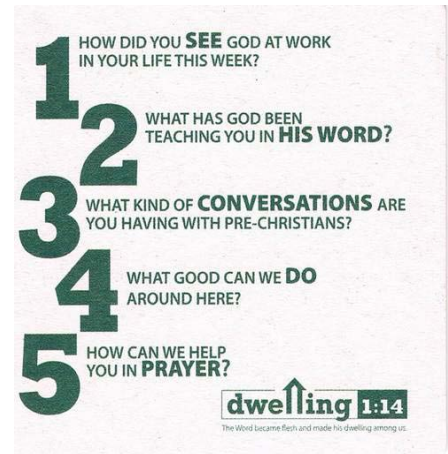

A Word from the Elders

We live in a modern era. Or, is it a post-modern era? Some might even argue that we're in a post-Christian era. What does that mean to the church? Is our belief system out dated? Do we need to modernize?

Believe it or not, this issue is not new. Even before Jesus was born, there were those in Israel that wanted to blend Judaism with the polytheistic religions of the time. They considered themselves progressive, and they were called the Sadducees. Concepts such as the resurrection of the dead were of no use to them.

Today, our beliefs are assaulted from all sides (and sometimes even from within). We are told that God is love and therefore, the law has no place. When one of the pillars of our faith is removed, we open the door to all sorts of absurdity. Beloved hymns have been excoriated as being overtly militant (Onward Christian Soldiers) or even anti-Semitic (O come Emanuel)! Ecumenical movements now embrace other religions not just denominations.

We should be thankful for the grace God has extended to us through His son, but James reminds us that faith without works is dead. Paul tells us that God disciplines as a father disciplines his children. Sometimes, love has to be tough.

As a synod, we believe in the inerrancy of scripture and its literal interpretation. How often have we heard that stories such as the biblical flood or Jonah are only fables used to convey some moral platitude? God said that heaven and earth shall pass away, but His word shall endure forever. This word does not change with the times.

What should we believe? Do we attend a LCMS church because that's how we were born and raised? Do we understand what our doctrine is? What prompted Martin Luther to write the small catechism? Why was his motto "Sola Scriptura" (scripture alone)?

Christ himself entrusted His church with spiritual authority on earth. Before ascending into heaven, He told Peter that what he loosed on earth would be loosed in heaven and what he bound on earth would be bound in heaven. He even went so far as to tell Peter that if he forgave anyone their sins they would be forgiven and if he withheld forgiveness, it would be withheld. That's an awesome responsibility. We dare not misinterpret what God has entrusted to us.

What's going on with the Property Ministry?

I know that submitting an article to the Newsletter about the Property Ministry isn't all that exciting but I've been thinking that it would be worthwhile to give you a *sampling* of the past year's property related accomplishments. So here goes:

These are the "routine" tasks that were accomplished in the last quarter:

1. Grounds maintenance
 - a. Tree and shrub trimming
 - b. Fertilizer and weed control materials applied to area in front of the church and to areas on either side of the church entrance
 - c. Mowing
2. Light bulbs/fluorescent tubes replaced as needed
3. Patio pavers replaced on the right side of the church
4. Furnace filters replaced
5. Repaired office furniture doors
6. Placed locks on HVAC breaker boxes

Note: I'm only showing one quarter's activities but, of course, these types of tasks need to be accomplished *all the time* and, if they weren't, it would have a significant impact on the functioning and beauty of our church. Frank Ringley and the "guys" accomplished all of them, with no labor cost to our church.

To Love

I remember asking this question in a Bible study at our church in Ohio. “Do you love your un-christian mother or father or son or daughter enough, if it were possible, to give up your place in heaven and exchange it for his/her place in hell?” No one felt comfortable answering that question. Nor did I. Now I think I can.

The Bible stresses the importance of love. A commandment, “You shall love your neighbor as yourself.” And 1 Corinthians 13:7,13 says, “Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things... So faith, hope, love abide, these three, but the greatest of these is love.” So, does that mean we should love our mother and father and children more than our everlasting life?

But then – Matthew 22:36-39: “Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law? And he said to him, ‘You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the *great* and *first* commandment. And a *second* is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’” (Emphasis mine). Then Jesus said in Matthew 10:37: “He who loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and he who loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me.”

We must pray for our unchristian family members. But we cannot take on their sin. Jesus already did that. They need to hear the Word, the Holy Spirit instilling faith in their hearts leading to repentance and forgiveness. Then someday, prayerfully, we will all be together at that wedding feast of the lamb, and forever in the promised new Jerusalem. “And the angel said to me, ‘Write this: Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb.’” (Revelation 19:9);

“Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away... I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband.... ‘Look, God's dwelling place is now among the people and he will dwell with them.’” (Revelation 21: 1-3)
